NEW Animated Video: Dr. Tipirneni Provides Overview of How to Fix Health Care System

Video Makes Case for More Consumer Choices, Public Option in Free-Market System, Quality, Affordable Health Care for Every American

GLENDALE, AZ – Today Dr. Hiral Tipirneni, an emergency room physician, cancer research advocate, and candidate for Arizona’s 8th Congressional District, released an animated video providing a more detailed overview of her plan to address the U.S. health care system, which is still in crisis and for which a fix seems mired in partisan, Washington gridlock.

“Imagine a health care system that covers all Americans, one where consumers have the freedom of choosing the health insurance plan that’s best for themselves or their families,” stated Dr. Tipirneni. “We need a robust Medicare buy-in option so we can encourage true free-market competition between private and public insurance plans to drive down costs and increase quality of care across the board,” Hiral added.

“Expanding health care coverage and choices, lowering costs, and delivering the highest quality of care possible should be nonpartisan goals,” said Dr. Tipirneni. “This vision for our health care system is not a Republican one or a Democratic one, but an American one,” Hiral declared.

In August 2017, Dr. Tipirneni called for a [bi-partisan fix to the Affordable Care Act](#), and issued her broad positions to stabilize and strengthen the current state of America’s health care system.
